



Fundraising ideas for schools

- Get your school or class involved and writing a Dog Tale. The story has to be related dogs or disability so it is relevant to Assistance Dogs Australia. This encourages children to enjoy writing as well as learn about dogs and disability.
- Run a best in show competition with a photo of everyone's dogs – have different categories like cutest dog, most spoilt or happiest looking dog and make a gold coin donation to enter
- Get your school to hold a mufti day. Wear something doggie related and make a gold coin donation



- Bake pup-cakes (cup cakes) or bone biscuits or make doggy bags (lolly bags) and sell them with all the money going to Assistance Dogs Australia.
- Get your local club or school to run a Hot Dog (or sausage sizzle)
- Design your own dog collar with your class or school. Everyone can make a donation to enter and the best collar wins a prize.
- Have a Howl-o-ween party and invite your friends. Get them to make a gold coin donation to come and dress up as their favourite doggie related character. Maybe you could be Little Red Riding Hood and your dog can be The Big Bad Wolf!
- Dog-stackle course – design your own obstacle course and get people to make a donation to use it
- Bring your dog to school day for a gold coin donation (maybe with mum!)
- Make paper-mache puppies
- Teach your dog new tricks- either film them at home to show the class or ask your teacher if you can bring your dog in too show everything h/she has learnt. You can get donations per trick.
