



## Fundraising ideas suitable for work, school and clubs

Category	Event name	Event Description
Sporting and health	Doggie walk	We're supposed to walk 10,000 steps each day, why not strap on those pedometers and see which team can rack up the most steps. See if your boss will match the number of steps by cent or entry fees. The winning team to receive a proportion of the profit
	Dog-Bowl	Bowling for dollars. Sign up for an bowling match. A few extra dollars are paid per person to raise funds for Assistance Dogs. You could even include prizes (apart from the glory of winning of course)
	Dog Race	Have two or more sporting competitors, set the challenge (race, swim, best in a round of golf, game of squash) each competitor sells supporter tickets for a dollar a ticket, all everyone else needs to do is pick the winning side.
	Dog-Leg	An excuse for a golf day, the loser makes a donation
	Office Olympics	Teams will participate in events such as making paper airplanes to see whose flies the longest distance; dress for success relay; shooting crumpled paper into wastebaskets, department darts etc. Either teams can pay a nominal entry fee or sell supporter tickets (as above)
	Hoops Contest	In a safe place, erect a nerf ball basketball hoop. Schedule a time for an elimination shooting match. Associates make a donation to enter the match and the winner receives a prize
Challenge	Office sweepstakes	Doughnut eating, diet challenge, quiz nights, team hockey, disco challenge, football keepy uppy anything goes. Set up the challengers, sell supporter cards and let battle commence
	Stationary challenge	\$2 per entry in to the paper challenge: Whose plane can travel the furthest, who can shoot crumpled paper in to the bin with the most accuracy, who can produce the best dogarami (origami)

<b>Food and beverage</b>	<b>Pup cakes</b>	Make pup cakes and sell them at work/your club/school or have a bake off
	<b>Hair of the Dog (adults only)</b>	Wind down on a Friday with after work drinks, for each drink consumed donate \$2
	<b>Bone-appetite</b>	Skip lunch at a restaurant and donate your lunch money
	<b>Food to sell and share</b>	Make doggie bags (dumplings, pasties) Dog Eye (Pizza) sausage dogs, Antipupsto (antipasto)
<b>Arts and Crafts</b>	<b>Dog Collar design</b>	Teams design collars, all pay \$5 entry, best design wins 50% prize money, the rest donated
<b>Photography</b>	<b>Match the dog to their owner</b>	Charge a small entry fee to guess. They say every dog looks like his owner.
<b>Tasks</b>	<b>Errand/Boy girl</b>	Make the tea, clean the desks- which team can charge and raise the most money
<b>Other</b>	<b>Dressing up/down</b>	Have a fancy dress competition, a best dressed or worst tie. Even come in casual for the day
	<b>Flea Market</b>	Sell any household or clothing item, or play swapsies

If team games aren't your thing there are plenty of activities you can carry out yourself or that your company, school or club can do:

- Bring your dog to work/school day
- Guess the number of lollies on the jar (\$0.50 a guess)
- Put a donation box in reception or by the coffee machine
- Adding a footer to your email pledging your support to Assistance Dogs
- Run a guessing competition (for example baby photos or a jar of jelly beans)
- Offer a dog wash service
